SUMMARY

This bill requires that any new contracts entered into and certain contracts renewed by the Office of Substance Abuse must be awarded through a request-for-proposal procedure. The bill also requires the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse to establish a procedure to obtain assistance and advice from consumers of alcohol and other drug abuse services regarding the selection of contracts. The bill also corrects a conflict created by 2 public laws, Public Law 1991, chapters 557 and 601, amending the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 20005, subsection 6, paragraph B.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1041) adds a fiscal note to the bill.

SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Department of Human Services to develop a comprehensive plan for protective and family support services for children.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1110) requires that the oversight committee established by the Department of Human Services develop its recommendations prior to the department's development of a plan. It also moves the reporting date for the plan from January 15 to March 1, 1993. The amendment broadens the charge and membership of the oversight committee and gives the committee access to confidential information. It also adds an appropriation section and fiscal note to the resolve.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-768) strikes the appropriation section and replaces the fiscal note. The Department of Human Services agreed to absorb the costs of preparing the plan within existing resources.

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation from entering into contracts with residential care facilities that give preference to patients of the Augusta Mental Health Institute or the Bangor Mental Health Institute.
