This resolve was one of the measures submitted by the Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring. The resolve would have directed the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System to undertake a study of the present structure of the university system and report its findings and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Education. It also would have directed the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System, the Board of Trustees of Maine Maritime Academy and any public education strategic planning group to examine options for integrating the programs of the university and the academy, including the possibility of adding the academy to the university system.
