SUMMARY

The bill enacts the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 11, Article 4-A, which is the State's version of the Uniform Commercial Code, Article 4A, governing the transfer of funds between banks by wire or by written instructions. The article is based on an article adopted by the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws and has been technically revised to conform to the Legislature's conventions for usage and numbering. Uniform law comments are included without any change except that cross-references to the uniform law are followed by cross-references to the Maine version in brackets.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1201): The amendment makes a technical correction to section 1 to reflect enactment of Public Law 1991, chapter 636. It also indicates typographical errors in the Uniform Comments.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

The bill provides immunity from civil liability for elected, noncompensated directors of rural electrification cooperatives for acts or omissions within the scope of activities of the cooperatives.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-641): The amendment corrects the citation to the chapter of the Maine Revised Statutes under which rural electrification cooperatives are organized.

SUMMARY

The bill adopted changes recommended by the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws as revisions to the Uniform Commercial Code, Article 3, on negotiable instruments. This bill repealed the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 11, Article 3 and enacted a new Title 11, Article 3-A to accomplish those revisions. The official Uniform Comments and the text of some new provisions refer to other conforming amendments in the Uniform Commercial Code. These amendments are not included in this bill.
