#### **SUMMARY**

This bill requires the State to reimburse St. Andre Home, Inc. for rental expenses, despite State accounting principles adopted in 1990 that disallow "less than arms length rental agreements like the one that St. Andre Home is a party to. In so doing, the relationship that St. Andre Home had previously with the State is restored.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1084) adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-769) strikes the appropriation section from the committee amendment and replaces the fiscal note.

### **SUMMARY**

This bill excludes certain Medicare payments for primary care physician training from the ordinary calculations made by the Maine Health Care Finance Commission to determine hospital revenue limits. This special regulatory treatment applies only to residency spaces explicitly approved by the commission with the advice of the Finance Authority of Maine's Advisory Committee on Medical Education. The bill also repeals recently enacted provisions for administering a primary residency training program for which funds are not available.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1109) adds a fiscal note to the bill.
