LD 197 **Resolve, to Consolidate the University of Maine at Fort Kent into the University of Maine at Presque Isle** **ONTP**

SPONSOR(S) **COMMITTEE REPORT** **AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**

SUMMARY

This bill would have directed the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System to develop a plan for merging the University of Maine at Fort Kent with the University of Maine at Presque Isle. The plan would have been presented by March 1, 1994 and the merger completed by September 1, 1995. The plan would also have included suggestions for use of the Fort Kent site following the merger.

LD 204 **An Act to Require the Trustees of the University of Maine System to Include Certain Projections in Their Annual Report to the Legislature** **ONTP**

SPONSOR(S) **COMMITTEE REPORT** **AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**

SUMMARY

This bill would have required Trustees of the University of Maine System to include in their annual report to the Legislature projections for the succeeding 5 years concerning enrollment, faculty, capital projects and necessary revenue.

LD 205 **An Act to Enhance the Effectiveness of the Quality Incentive Adjustment Allocation** **ONTP**

SPONSOR(S) **COMMITTEE REPORT** **AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**

SUMMARY

Under current law, the quality incentive adjustment allocation is connected solely to a school administrative unit's operating costs. This bill would have changed the focus of the adjustment from one of higher-than-average expenditures by school administrative units to one of higher-than-average achievement by school administrative units, based on performance on the statewide educational assessment tests.

LD 212 **An Act to Appropriate Funds for the Maintenance and Restoration of the Landmark Site "Montpelier" in Thomaston** **ONTP**

SUMMARY

This bill would have provided a General Fund appropriation of \$250,000 to the Maine Historic Preservation Commission for the maintenance and restoration of the landmark site "Montpelier" in Thomaston.
