This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill gives the Task Force on Defense Realignment and the Economy an additional year to submit a strategic plan and recommendations, and provides an additional year to submit legislation. The bill adds an additional duty, requiring the task force to monitor federal funds and develop necessary steps to apply for those funds.

The committee amendment (H-177) substitutes the word "dependency" for the word "capacity", and adds a fiscal note to the bill.

SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Department of Economic and Community Development to study the use of industrial development bonds and how they might assist industries in the State.

The resolve was later considered and passed as a joint resolution memorializing Congress and the President to pass legislation that would amend the internal revenue code, so that the availability of small issue industrial development bonds could be restored.
