This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

This bill proposed to exempt, subject to agreement through the collective bargaining process, employees of the Public Utilities Commission from mandatory furlough and shutdown days.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-390), which was the majority report of the committee, replaced the bill. The amendment proposed to exempt positions allocated to the Public Utilities Commission, other than commissioners, from the discretionary furlough and shutdown days. This exemption would have been subject to approval by the parties signatory to any agreement governing furlough days and shutdown days.

SUMMARY

This bill was carried forward from the 1st Regular Session.

The bill proposed to require the Public Utilities Commission, upon petition, to adopt economic development rate tariffs for electric utilities. Any rate adopted would have been required to be designed to encourage economic development in the State such as job creation and the attraction of new businesses to the State. The commission would have been prohibited from establishing a rate which was lower than the utility's long-run marginal cost plus 1 cent per kilowatt hour.

SUMMARY

This bill was carried forward from the 1st Regular Session.

The current charter of the Passamaquoddy Water District makes all property of the district subject to property taxation. Legal issues were raised about this provision. The bill proposed to exempt all property of the district from taxation. The minority report of the committee (H-899) proposed to strike the tax provision from the charter, which would have resulted in the property of the district becoming tax exempt to the extent provided by Title 36, section 651.
