An Act Regarding the Motor Vehicle Emission Inspection Program

SUMMARY

This bill would have required a contractor operating a public emissions inspection station to issue a notice for a motor vehicle that fails to meet public emission standards, stating the cause of failure and the repairs necessary to bring the vehicle into emission standards compliance.

The bill would have also made a certificate of compliance valid for 2 years from the date of issuance, regardless of motor vehicle transfers.

SUMMARY

This bill would exempt compacts or agreements made with the State of South Carolina for the storage of low-level radioactive waste from the statewide ratification provisions of current law.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-786) provides that the only contract with South Carolina that may be entered into without voter approval is a contract for temporary rights to dispose of low-level radioactive waste from the United States Naval Facility in Kittery. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

SUMMARY

This bill expands the permissible uses of the underground oil tank loan program under the jurisdiction of the Finance Authority of Maine. It permits FAME to make grants or loans for aboveground oil storage tank or facility construction or replacement and for gasoline station vapor recovery projects. The bill also raises the ceiling on loans or grants to a single entity from \$300,000 to \$600,000, and provides for grants of up to \$35,000 for smaller gasoline station owners who are required to install vapor recovery equipment. The bill allows FAME to provide mortgage insurance for loans related to aboveground storage tank projects and vapor recovery projects.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-868) adds definitions for aboveground oil storage facility and tank, provides that an applicant for assistance with a vapor recovery or control project must be given a grant only if the person is not able to repay a loan, and makes other technical changes to the bill. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
