This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to amend the charter of the Newport Water District by amending the territory to include part of the Town of Palmyra and also to add 2 additional members to the board of trustees. The bill also proposed to amend the compensation that the board members receive for attending board meetings.

The committee amendment (H-134) strikes and replaces the bill. Under this amendment the Newport Water District is authorized to contract with the Town of Palmyra or with persons or businesses in the Town of Palmyra for the purpose of supplying water to those who wish to purchase water.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to establish a total least-cost energy policy. The bill also proposed to impose a moratorium on the permitting, construction or operation of electric generation plants fired by fossil fuel, except for natural gas, until June 1, 1995 and to provide for a report by the Public Utilities Commission by March 1, 1995 so that the Legislature might determine whether an extension of the moratorium or enactment of other measures were necessary.
