This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to amend the charter of the East Pittston Water District by making the property of the district exempt from all taxation in the Town of Pittston.

LD 1248 **An Act to Require Provision of Information to Consumers by the Public Utilities Commission** ONTP

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to require the Public Utilities Commission to provide to customers of a public utility information stating the utility's profits and a summary of its rates, tolls and charges.

LD 1261 **An Act to Amend the Charter of the Kingfield Water District** ONTP

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to amend the charter of the Kingfield Water District to require approval by the inhabitants of the town before the trustees of the water district borrow money.

LD 1325 **An Act to Decrease the Cost of Purchased Power to Electric Utility Customers in the State** ONTP

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to require use of a discount rate for determining the value of power purchase contracts (for purposes of buy-outs or buy-downs) that is not higher than the cost of debt to finance the buy-out or buy-down of the contract. The bill also proposed to allow the cost of such buy-outs or buy-downs to be flowed through the fuel adjustment clause, in the same manner by which the cost of power purchased is recovered today.

LD 1326 **An Act to Require that All Interest on Escrowed Assessments on Utilities Be Used for the Benefit of the Public Utilities Commission and the Office of the Public Advocate** CARRIED OVER

SUMMARY

This bill proposes to require that after July 1, 1995, all interest on funds or investments from the Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund and the Public Advocate Regulatory Fund be credited to those funds.
