This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

## SUMMARY

This bill allows a register of deeds to return illegible documents. It also increases the recording fees for plans and eliminates a duplicate recording requirement.

The committee amendment ( $\mathrm{H}-383$ ) removes sections 2 , which raises the fees and removes section 3 , the recording requirement.

## SUMMARY

This bill prohibits local ordinances that regulate or require permits for indoor private gatherings in private residences. The purpose of this bill is to protect the constitutional rights of free speech and free association.

## LD 1336 RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of ONTP Maine to Allow Maine Citizens to Propose Constitutional Amendments by Initiative

## SUMMARY

This constitutional resolution amends the Constitution of Maine to permit citizens to initiate amendments to the Constitution. A citizen-initiated amendment requires approval by $2 / 3$ of the voters at a referendum, ratification by majority of the Legislature and signature of the Governor. The Governor's veto of the amendment may be overridden by a majority vote in both Houses.
