All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act to Ensure the Proper Installation of Manufactured Homes

SUMMARY

In 1989 the Legislature required the Manufactured Housing Board to adopt standards for the installation of manufactured homes in the State. The board has adopted those standards. This bill requires that all manufactured homes be installed in accordance with those standards.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-728) replaces the original bill. The amendment establishes standards for permanent foundations for both newer mobile homes and modular homes; but does not address the issue of adopting the standards of the Manufactured Housing Board.

SUMMARY

This bill creates the Regional Revolving Loan Fund to assist businesses to create or retain jobs. The Finance Authority of Maine will assist regional development corporations in administering the program. There is a \$75,000 loan maximum. The Regional Revolving loan fund was incorporated in LD 1547, contingent upon the passage of the bond issue.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies the mission of the Commission on Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering. The bill also redefines the powers and duties of the commission setting forth specific criteria for regulating genetically engineered products.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-877) replaces the bill and establishes the Commission to Study Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering. Specifically, the 14-member commission is charged with identifying and reviewing existing state laws that provide authority for regulating products and activities, such as food and agricultural laws, health and safety laws, confidential business information laws and environmental laws. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" (S-554) TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-877) adds an emergency preamble and clause and directs the Commission to Study Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering to consider mechanisms by which both risks and benefits created by the use of biotechnology and genetic engineering products and waste products may be evaluated. The Senate Amendment also adds the President of the Maine Science and Technology Foundation as an ex officio member and requires that the environmental scientist be familiar with biotechnology and genetic engineering issues.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" (H-1058) clarifies that the president of the Maine Science and Technology Foundation is not subject to the appointment procedure.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes a permitting center within the Department of Economic and Community Development, Office of Business Development. The center will allow businesses to get all necessary state license or permit applications in one location. The center also mediates disputes between permitting agencies and businesses and tracks permitting actions within State Government.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes a residential home energy-rating system and an energy-efficient mortgage pilot program to promote energy efficiency in existing residential buildings, by ensuring availability of energy efficiency information at the time of sale. LD 1408 in the Banking and Insurance Committee establishes a task force to look at the home energy rating system.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this bill is to establish a Capital Access Program. The Capital Access program is designed to give banks a flexible tool to make business loans that are somewhat riskier than a conventional bank loan. This bill was incorporated in LD 1547, contingent upon passage of the bond issue.
