This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### SUMMARY

The 115th Legislature, through its enactment of Resolve 1991, chapter 43, directed the Maine Technical College System Board of Trustees to establish the Commission to Study the Need for a Technical College in York County. The commission, composed of leaders from the business community, membership organizations, education and labor throughout the southern part of the State, upon conducting a series of meetings, including public hearings, to collect and analyze data and public opinion, concluded that a technical college should be established for the availability of technical education to the citizens of York County. This bill appropriated \$1,800,000 funds to the Maine Technical College System to establish a technical college in York County.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-851) would have provided additional information on establishing a technical college in York County. The funding would have supported the hiring of the necessary administrators, faculty and other staff, training equipment for programs, rental of facilities and other needs of a new college in preparation for incoming students in January 1995.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-989) would have added York County Technical College to the list of technical colleges that are located in the State.

LD 1775 was indefinitely postponed and the language describing establishment of the York County Technical College moved into the budget bill. Funding was reduced from \$1.8 to \$1.2 million dollars. An additional \$600,000 will be required annually to fully fund the York County Technical College.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill would have established the York County Continuing Education Authority. The authority would have been charged with creating and reporting to the First Regular Session of the 117th Legislature a plan to implement a program of education in technical disciplines and apprenticeship training in York County for secondary school graduates and nontraditional students. The plan would have addressed curriculum, capital and operating budgets and administration of the program by the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System, public secondary schools or any combination of these
