SUMMARY

This citizen initiated bill prohibits a person from becoming a candidate for the United States House of Representatives if that person served in that body during 6 or more of the previous 11 years or for the United States Senate if that person served in that body during 12 or more of the previous 17 years. The bill applies only to federal congressional candidates whose terms begin on or after January 1, 1995. Since the bill was not enacted, it will be submitted to the voters for approval in November.
