SUMMARY

This bill would have allowed members who served in the Peace Corps, VISTA or in a foreign teaching capacity to purchase service credits for the Maine State Retirement System by paying an amount equal to the employee contribution for the period plus interest, rather than the full actuarial cost of the added benefit.

SUMMARY

Resolve 1991, chapter 74 authorized the transfer of land at the Bangor Mental Health Institute to the Maine Veterans' Homes for the construction of a veterans' home in Bangor with the provision that the land revert to the State if a veterans' home was not constructed on the land by June 30, 1993. Construction is underway on the Bangor veterans' home but will not be completed by June 30, 1993. This resolve clarifies the intent of chapter 74 so that construction of the Bangor veterans' home may continue on schedule. It also defines permissible mortgage uses of the site that are the same as those applicable to the Augusta veterans' home, and approved by the Legislature in 1989.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" (H-1035) removes the emergency preamble and emergency clause from the bill.
