Bill Summaries, 119th Legislature, 1st Regular Session

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 1st Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 1st Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is September 18, 1999. Joint orders are effective when passed.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

LD 1617 proposed to prohibit the transfer of any available balance from a "children's program" for any other purpose without the specific authorization of the Legislature. The bill proposed to define some of the existing programs that fall under this prohibition. The bill also proposed to require the State Budget Officer to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs by January 7, 2000 that identified all resources within State Government used primarily for children's programs, a statement about the purpose of the programs and the amounts available in each fiscal year of the next biennium.

LD 1651 proposed to create the Tobacco Settlement Dedicated Fund to receive revenue from the settlement of litigation between the State and the tobacco manufacturers. The fund could have been used for payment of health care costs for persons who use tobacco products; smoking cessation public education, seminars, treatment clinics and costs; expansion of the elderly low-cost drug program under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 254 to cover health care expenses for smoking-related illness and disease; and health care coverage for persons who are unable to afford coverage.
