LEGISLATIVE DIGEST OF BILL SUMMARIES AND ENACTED LAWS

This Legislative Digest of Bill Summaries and Enacted Laws summarizes all LDs and adopted amendments and all laws enacted or finally passed during the First Regular Session of the 125th Maine Legislature.

The *Digest* is arranged alphabetically by committee and within each committee by Legislative Document (LD) number. The committee report(s), prime sponsor and lead co-sponsor(s), if designated, are listed below each LD title. All adopted amendments are summarized and listed by paper number. A subject index is included with each committee. The appendices include a summary of relevant session statistics, an index of all bills by LD number and an index of enacted laws by law type and chapter number.

Final action on each LD is noted to the right of the LD title. The following describes the various final actions.

LD 1171 An Act To Amend the Pine Tree Development Zone Laws To Provide a ONTP Better Measurement of Per Capita Income

Sponsor(s)	Committee Report	Amendments Adopted
SHAW DIAMOND	ONTP	

This bill permits the income calculations that define qualified employees under the Pine Tree Development Zone program to be based on the income average of neighboring counties for a business located near the county borders.

LD 1194An Act Regarding Contracts Awarded by the Maine State HousingMAJORITYAuthority for the Installation or Servicing of Energy-efficient(ONTP) REPORTAppliances in Low-income Households(ONTP)

This bill requires the Maine State Housing Authority, when awarding contracts to install or service energy-efficient replacement refrigerators or freezers in low-income households, to award those contracts on a regional basis to different suppliers and only to suppliers that do business primarily within the State and provide delivery and post-installation servicing services by the same supplier.

LD 1207 An Act To Amend the Labor Laws Relating to Certain Agricultural Carried Over Employees

<u>Sponsor(s)</u>	Committee Report	Amendments Adopted

This bill removes the provision that requires that individuals employed for or at an egg processing facility that has over 300,000 laying birds be subjected to state minimum wage and overtime laws. It also repeals the laws that govern labor relations between agricultural workers and an agricultural employer that operates an egg processing facility that has over 500,000 laying birds and that employs more than 100 agricultural employees.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-268)

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. It eliminates those sections of the bill that remove the requirement that individuals employed at an egg processing facility with more than 300,000 laying birds be subject to state minimum wage and overtime laws.

This bill was carried over to any special and/or regular session of the 125th Legislature by joint order, H.P. 1190.
