LEGISLATIVE DIGEST OF BILL SUMMARIES AND ENACTED LAWS

This Legislative Digest of Bill Summaries and Enacted Laws contains summaries of all LDs and adopted amendments and all laws enacted or finally passed during the First Regular Session of the 127th Maine Legislature.

The *Digest* is arranged alphabetically by committee and within each committee by Legislative Document (LD) number. The committee report(s), prime sponsor and lead co-sponsor(s), if designated, are listed below each LD title. All adopted amendments are summarized and listed by paper number. A subject index is included with each committee. An appendix provides a summary of relevant session statistics.

Final action on each LD is noted to the right of the LD title. The following describes the various final actions.

LD 534 An Act To Increase Crisis Intervention Training in the State **ONTP** Amendments Adopted Sponsor(s) Committee Report **MALABY** This bill requires that, beginning January 2017, at least 20% of law enforcement officers in a municipal police department and in a county sheriff department must complete the so-called Memphis model of crisis intervention team training. Beginning June 2017, officers who have not completed this training must be certified in mental health first aid. LD 535 **Accepted Majority** An Act To Amend the Laws Governing the Concealed Handguns Permit (ONTP) Report **Application** Sponsor(s) Amendments Adopted DUNPHY L **BRAKEY** This bill removes questions about marijuana use from the concealed handguns permit application. LD 548 An Act To Provide a Concealed Handgun Permit for Active Military **ONTP Members** Sponsor(s) Amendments Adopted WARD **BRAKEY** This bill allows a person who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or a state's military forces to be eligible for a permit to carry a concealed handgun if the person is not otherwise prohibited by law from possessing a firearm. LD 549 **ONTP** Resolve, To Create the Task Force on Disaster Resiliency Sponsor(s) **Amendments Adopted** RYKERSON

This resolve establishes the Task Force on Disaster Resiliency to investigate and strengthen the State's disaster response to extreme weather and sea level rise events.
