To Glenn W. Starkey, State Superintendent of Public Schools  
Re: Limit on Payments to Towns for High Schools

Replying to yours of the 7th. . . asking for an opinion as to whether or not a town which is receiving from the State for high school purposes five hundred dollars, with the condition thereto that the high school maintained is a class C high school, shall be reimbursed for tuition paid by the town.

Upon examination of the law it is my opinion that it cannot; that in no event should the amount received by a town from the State exceed five hundred dollars. . .
