To A. W. Gordon, Agent for Unorganized Townships, Education
Re: Failure of Plantation to hold an Annual Meeting

. . . . I am unable to find any authority for the statement that if a plantation does not hold a meeting to elect officers it thereby becomes disorganized and drops back into the class of unorganized townships.

It is my opinion that unless specifically disorganized by the legislature, an organized plantation remains an organized plantation.
