To State Highway Commission
Re: Date of Revocation of Operator's License

In reply to your question as to the proper construction of Section 73 of Chapter 211 of the Public Laws of 1921, relating to operators' licenses which have been revoked, you are advised that it is the opinion of this department that the year referred to, after which the Commission may authorize the issuance of a new license or permit, begins on the day of revocation of the old license after a final conviction. If an appeal has been taken from the judgment of the trial court, which appeal is afterwards overruled and the judgment below affirmed, the date of the revocation after such judgment on the appeal is the beginning of the year mentioned, and one year from that time would be the earliest date at which the Commission could entertain a petition for a new license.
