## July 18, 1931

To Allen J. Neal, Secretary, Board of Veterinary Examiners Re: Special Certificate to Sherman S. Greenleaf under P&SL 1931, Ch.124

. . . You will note from a copy which I enclose of a Private and Special Act of the current Legislature that Mr. Greenleaf was specially authorized to practice as a veterinarian upon payment of the annual license tee required of other registered practitioners. You will also note the provisos against his use of certain titles, and that his practice shall only extend to the animals belonging to certain persons.

It is proper that you should enter him upon your records as specially authorized by virtue of this Act and issue to him a special certificate. If you will send me the form of certificate which you ordinarily use I will suggest the proper modifications to conform to the statute, or you may draft this yourself and send the document to me for examination and I will forward it to his attorney if it is duly in form. Your certificate might properly be limited to authorizing him to practise "only in accordance with" the Act above referred to, a copy of the Act being included in or appended to the certificate.
