Dear Mr. Conners:

In response to your letter of February 25, I am pleased to inform you that there does not appear to be any provision of the statutes which would permit ice fishing on the streams and rivers of the state; such fishing being limited to certain of the lakes and ponds. I do not have in mind any streams, rivers or brooks in which ice fishing is permitted.

I was much pleased to learn that Henry Hughes was making such improvement in health. I sincerely hope that he may soon regain his usual strength so as to again enter upon the warden service; both on account of himself and the state. It always seemed to me that he was a very efficient and worth while warden. Should you see him I shall appreciate it if you will extend to him my regards and good wishes.
