Dear Sir:

In line with your memorandum of May 9, concerning the second and final report of expenditures before election of the delegates to the constitutional convention, I am of the opinion that you should allow the reports to be received until 10 A. M. of September 4, even though that day is Labor Day. It was designated as a holiday by the legislature several sessions ago, and at this last session they had a perfect right, and apparently saw fit, to provide for the transaction of business on that day.

The Act itself specifically limits the time and in my opinion you should abide by the strict letter of the Act and accept the reports up until the hour designated.
