Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter of May 2, concerning Frank Lake, No. 5938, I have examined the authorities and am of the opinion that where a person is sentenced to imprisonment on two charges, the sentences ~~not~~ to run concurrently, he is entitled to his time off on both sentences.

The rule, however, seems to be that where the two sentences run concurrently he would be entitled to his time off for good behavior on simply one of the sentences. This seems to be the rule in other states, our own Court never having passed upon the matter.
