To Lucius D. Barrows, Chief Engineer, State Highway Department

With reference to the communication from S. A. Piper of Troy to your department, dated September 25, 1933, I am pleased to advise you that a person has a right to drive his cattle or sheep across or along a highway provided he uses due care in doing so. The driver of an automobile has the same rights in the highway as the driver of cattle and he must use due care and diligence in so driving his car, and in case of accident by which his car is damaged, or by which cattle or sheep are injured, the person guilty of negligence in causing such accident would be held liable for the damages sustained.
