> Re: Jaces Colvin (allen) Application for Hunting and Fishing License.

Dear Sir:

From all the information which I have regarding this man and his application it appears that he has lived at Sanford, in this state, continuously for more than two years, and that he has and is paying taxes on real estate in the town of Sanford where he lives, which appears, under the provisions of Section 40 of the Inland Fish and Game Laws of 1933, to entitle him to a license.

He evidently has purchased from the Samford Mills Corporation the home in which he lives and has received from his granter a band for a deed which obligates him to pay the taxes on the property which, as far as my information goes, he has paid. Section 40, aforesaid, does not say that the legal title to the real estate must be in the alien. It simply requires that he has "Lived in this state continuously for 2 years, and in addition thereto pays tax on real estate in the city or town in which he fosides".
