In response to your comunication of November 14, relative to the letter of November 13 from the A. Lane, I am pleased to suggest the Chapter 231, Section 55, of the Public Laws of 1931, provines that

t is further provided in said section that,-

The state or the town shall not be liable for accidents while the road surface is covered with snow or ice.

This provision of the statutes appears to be a complete ensuer to the claim made by Er. Lane.
