Dear Sir:

In compliance with your request for a ruling on the construction of Sections 95 and 96 of Chapter 12 of the Revised Statutes, I am of the opinion that the last part of Section 96,—

"Provided that the minimum to be paid under the provisions of this section shall never be less than two dollars"

was not intended to deprive an applicant for registration of the credit allowed under Section 95, and that tax collectors may not legally collect two dollars where credit from a previous registration would render it unnecessary.
