Dear Er. Rand:

Is line with your letter of January 24, I beg to advise that I have studied the question prepounded quite carefully and, while we have no decisions in the State of Laine exactly on the point, I are of the opinion that those jewelers who are fitting spectable frames, bending and adjusting them to the eyes of patrons, duplicating broken lenses and changing lenses from one counting to another, are doing so in violation of the law regarding licensing of optometrists.

all of the above acts are a necessary part of the proper fitting of glasses to the eyes, and are acts requiring skill. Obviously the legislature, in requiring optometrists to be registered, had in mind to preclude such acts by those who had not demonstrated to the Board of Registration the ability to perform properly.
