To State Highway Commission
Re: Right of Access by Abutting Owners.

In response to your letter of November 27, in which you enclosed copy of letter from Ware-Butler, Inc., I am pleased to inform you that abutting owners have the right of access to the Highway.

You will recall that a few years ago we went over this matter in connection with the Randolph end of the Randolph-Gardiner bridge, when a portion of the guard rail had to be removed to provide an entrance to an abutting owner's building which he erected after the bridge was completed.
