To Milton L. Bradford, Vocational Instructor in Agriculture, Limington
Re: Transportation of Pupils

. . . I am pleased to suggest to you, informally and unofficially, that, under the provisions of Chapter 131 of the Public Laws of 1935, it will be necessary for the person transporting the children you mention, if he uses a motor vehicle, to give the bond or procure insurance as provided in said chapter.

The fact that he has liability insurance on his car is not sufficient compliance with the law.
