Gentlemen:

I am in receipt of W. L. De Wolfe's letter to you dated August 30, relative to the new advertising law, and especially with reference to permits for advertising on the Oxford County Fair fence with the corporation limits of South Paris.

The only question, it seems to me, is whether or not the Fair Grounds fence is within the compact or built up portion of Paris. This law does not define compact sections. In the absence of such definition it seems to me that it is proper for you to apply the definition given in Section 69 of Chapter 29 of the Motor Vehicle Law which appears to be the last word of the legislature with reference to the meaning of "compact sections".
