In response to your letter of april 15, I am pleased to inform you that the distinction between an inn and a boarding house, or lodging house, is that the former infor the accommodation of all persons who choose to come and who are in a condition fit to be received, without any prior or express agreement as to the duration of their stay; while the latter is for the accommodation of such persons as the proprietor chooses to receive under a contract for a certain period of time and at a certain rate,

The distinction between an innkeeper and the kesper of a boarding house or a lodging house, is that the latter, not having made a profession of willingness to serve the public, is at liberty to choose his guests, and to make special arrangements with them, while an innkeeper is pledged to entertain all travelers of good conduct and with means of payment.
