Deer Captein Towler

In reply to your letter of May 4, addressed to Clyde R. Chapmen, Attorney Genera, you ask! "Has a State Police Officer the right to be a Justice of the Peacet".

I do not find that the Court has ever passion this exact question, but it has been held by our Court in certain cases that, "The office of Justice of the Pease und constable of a town has been held to be incompatible; and the office of Justice of the Peace and Sproner is incompatible.".

The Court has further held that the office of Justice of the Peace is incompatible with that of sheriff, deputy sheriff or coroner.

From the foregoing, I am inclined to the opinion that a State Police Officer cannot rightfully be a Justice of the Peace.
