Dear Doctor Hanson:

Answering your inquiry relative to the renovation of the existing water supply system and the installation of a sewerage disposal plant, in connection with the building improvement authorized by the Eighty-seventh Legislature at the Northern Maine Sanatorium, I am pleased to suggest that as a sufficient water supply system and an adequate sewerage disposal plant is a necessary part of the construction and improvement contemplated, you are justified in constructing a water and sewerage system commensurate with the sanatorium requirements, provided you keep within your appropriation.

The foregoing is also applicable to your inquiry regarding the Western Maine Sanatorium.

I am also of the opinion that if you find that a new building at the Central Maine Sanatorium is preferable to an "addition" to the nurses' home, you will be justified in making the change if it can be done within the appropriation therefor.
