Augusta, June 4, 1936

Frank H. Cooper of Belfast, Special Investigator with the Department of the Attorney General at Augusta, and James A. Cummings, Sheriff of Washington County, have completed an investigation into the death of Kenneth Brown whose body was found floating off Wilson's Beach at Campobello Island, New Brunswick, on May 23, 1936; and as a result of the investigation have arrived at the conclusion, which is shared by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, that however Brown met his death, that death occurred on the Canadian side of the border.

Accordingly, the above State of Maine officials have suspended any further inquiry and whatever investigation is now held will be conducted by the Canadian authorities.
