To State Highway Commission
Re: Outdoor Advertising - Lights

In response to your letter of August 10, in which you inquire relative to the string of lights suspended over and across the highway, I am pleased to suggest that the matter is not entirely free from doubt.

In case the lights are exhibited from the premises of the owner, it would seem doubtful if it would be in violation of the outdoor advertising statute.

If it was outside the premises of the owner, it might well be considered that it was in violation of the statute.

It seems to be a matter that should be made definite by the next legislature, as I can understand, as you suggest, that it might create a hazard.
