Dear Lou:

Shortly after you looked in the door yesterday afternoon, the members of the Maine State Board of Nurses examiners came in the office and I started to look for you but you had apparently left the State House.

What is bothering them is that there is nurse named Helen G. Benson who is employed by the Great Northern Paper Company at Millinocket, and who uses the letters "R. N." to designate herself as a registered nurse, and yet who is not entitled to use these letters not having taken the State Board examinations. She claimed at one time to be a registered nurse in Massachusetts but our State Board was unable to confirm this.

The Board had some correspondence last year with Dr. Sanger, and I hope you will be willing to get in touch with him and the officials of the company and see if this matter cannot be straightened out. The Nurses' Board is doing a fine work and little things like this are very troublesome to them.
