Re: Aeroplane Flights.

Dear Jim:

Governor Barrows received on Monday a telegram from Honorable Cordell Hull indicating that he was very anxious to receive an immediate reply to his former letters and telegrams concerning flights of Canadian Mounted Police aircraft across the State. We have been giving this matter very serious consideration as you know.

Congressman Brewster was in Augusta today and after conferring with him the Governor wrote a letter to Mr. Hull, a copy of which I am enclosing. You will note that this letter limits any permission for aeroplane flights across the State to these government planes, and places certain restrictions on the permits.

I shall be very pleased to keep you informed of further developments concerning this important question.
