Gentlemen:

The Commissioner of Agriculture, Mr. Washburn, has handed to us your letter of July 21, relative to the recently effective law regulating the purchase of dressed poultry, and I am enclosing a copy of the law (Chapter 105, P. L. 1937) effective July 24.

In our opinion this law applies to the purchase of poultry on commission as well as to purchases for cash or any other terms. The provisions of the act requiring these reports apply only to dressed poultry but there are several other provisions of our statute regulating the transportation of poultry not included in this act, and in which you are not at this time interested.
