Dear Mr. King:

I very much regret to have to return your corporation certificate without my approval, owing to the fact that after a careful investigation of the Statutes relative to the practice of law, including chapter 142 of the Public Laws of 1937, I fail to find any provisions whereby a corporation can be admitted to the Bar of this State, or authorized to practice law, or any branch thereof, within the State.

It seems to me that it may fairly be inferred from your certificate that one, at least, of the objects of the corporation is to practice law by rendering legal aid to certain persons within the State,
