Re: Deer Isle-Sedgwick Bridge

Dear Sir:

In response to your inquiry of January 5, in regard to the agreements and contracts relative to the construction of the Deer Isle-Sedgwick Bridge and with reference to the trustee process Williamson against Robinson & Steinman and the Bridge District Trustee, I am pleased to suggest that this trustee action does not appear to affect the validity of the revised contract in any way except, possibly, as to the amount Robinson & Steinman are entitled to recover from the District under the contract, which may determine the amount, if any, which the District may deduct from the engineer's expense specified in the contract.

The agreement, a copy of which you enclosed, seems to be the consummation of several previous agreements, none of which had quite met final contract requirements, which when accepted and executed by you will constitute a valid contract.

After a careful reading of an opinion given you under date of January 8, by Honorable Percy T. Clarke in which we concur, I do not deem it necessary to discuss the matter further.
