Dear Mr. Hayford:

I have your letter of January 6, asking about the effect of Chapter 206 of the Public Laws of 1937, on the provisions of Chapter 94, section 38 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, relative to auditing the accounts of the counties in connection with the maintenance of jails.

In my opinion the provisions of Chapter 206 of the Public Laws of 1937, are broad enough to cover all of the financial transactions of the counties including those having to do with the matter of furnishing supplies for the jails, and that an audit under the earlier provisions of the statute is unnecessary.
