The question raised in your letter of January 27, is one which we have previously discussed with the Secretary of State, and we had concluded that a law enforcement officer on salary, or per diem, from a town, county, State or Federal branch of the government was not required to use taxi plates as you call them, or to carry public insurance in order for him legally to transport prisoners as a part of his duty as such law enforcement officer.
