Mr. Benjamin Chambers Grand Lake Stream Maine

Dear Siri

I am pleased to inform you that the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game, in connection with the construction and maintenance of a feeding station for fish at Grand Lake Stream, has taken in the name of the State a piece of your land described as follows:

Beginning 173:-0" from the West side of Water Street, so-called, on Benjamin Chamber's North line, and Simon Wolfson's South line, at iron pin; thence easterly 28:-0" and N61°0"E; thence southerly direction 208:-6" and parallel to Benjamin Chamber's West line, to his South line; then 28:-0" to the Southwest corner of his property and the St. Croix Paper Co. on the South; thence 208:-6" along the original West line of said Chember's lot to point of beginning, and consisting of 13/100 the acres:

and has caused the same to be surveyed and a plan thereof filed in the Registry of Deeds at Machias in the county of Washington, all in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 99 of the Public Laws of 1981.

It is provided in said chapter that you are entitled to damages to be paid by the State, the same to be estimated by the County Commissioners, on written application of either party made within one year after the filing of the plan showing the location of the land taken.
