Dear Madam:

The question as to whether or not B. C. Bubar, Jr. was entitled to have his name placed as a candidate for Legislature on the Primary ballot was raised by his opponent in the Primary, the Honorable Oscar Maxell.

The Secretary of State told Mr. Maxell right after conferring with this office that Mr. Bubar was entitled to have his name placed on the ballot.

Investigation disclosed that Mr. Bubar became of age on June 17, 1938, having been born on June 17, 1917 according to a certified birth certificate which was sent to him by the Clerk of the town of Weston.

The Secretary of State conferred with me before making this ruling and it had my full approval.

I, of course, cannot be giving you any advice as any future action you might take to contest the validity of Mr. Bubar's election you will have to work out with the aid of some attorney hired by you.
