Dear Mr. MacDonald:

I have discussed on several occasions, the status of the Indian Agent with Mr. Nayes of the Personnel Board, but as far as his appointment is concerned, I think it is still clear that he is to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council.

When section 2 of chapter 17 of the Revised Lt.tutes was transferred to section 241 of chapter 1 of the Public Laws of 1933, the Legertment of Bealth and Welfare was granted general supervision over the Indian tribes, but if you will notice in the next section, section 142, the section providing for the appointment by the Covernor and Council of the agent, and re-enacted, and so it is my opinion that he abould continue to be appointed as before.
