Dear Sir:

In re Fish Screen, Rangeley Lake.

Section 11, Page 10, of your Fourth Biennial
Revision provides that:

"The commissioner may authorize, alter
and remove the screening of any inland waters, and
shall, upon application, make suitable provision
for the passage of logs, lumber and pulpwood in
any floatable waters of the state so screened.
The commissioner may prohibit fishing within 500
yards of any screen installed by authority of the
department or of the legislature. No person shall
take up, destroy or injure any such screen or fish
in waters closed to fishing by this section."

The foregoing appears to give you full control
over the screen which Mr. Cliff S. Hill is complaining
about.
