STATE OF MAINE
Kennebec Bridge Loan Bonds
Issue of 1927, Third Series, 4s
Principal Due January 1, 1951.

In answer to your recent inquiry, I am pleased to inform you that these bonds appear to be valid obligations of the State of Maine even though the original signature of the Governor, and the Seal of the State have been partially obliterated by some cause unknown to me, but apparently by having been wet.

Both the Governor's signature and the State's Seal impress are, by careful scrutiny, readily discernible.

I am of the opinion that you are justified in causing the Seal of the State to be reimpresed on the back of each bond, and returning the bonds to the owner.
